Peipei Qiu is Louise Boyd Dale and Alfred Lichtenstein Chair Professor at Vassar College. She joined the Vassar faculty in 1994 after teaching for two years at Fordham University. She received her BA and MA from Peking University and M.Phil. and PhD from Columbia University. A specialist in Japanese literature, Professor Qiu teaches a wide range of courses in Japanese and Chinese literature, language, Asian Studies, and Women's Studies. Her research interests include Japanese poetry, comparative studies of Japanese and Chinese literature, Daoist tradition in East Asian literature, women in East Asian literature and societies, and Japanese language pedagogy. She is the author of Chinese Comfort Women: Testimonies from Imperial Japan's Sex Slaves (University of British Columbia Press, 2013; Oxford University Press, 2014; Hong Kong University Press, 2014) and Bashô and the Dao: The Zhuangzi and the Transformation of Haikai (University of Hawai'i Press, 2005).


